# Pastor's Message of the Week

John 14:15-21

'If you love me, you will keep my commandments." We tend to think of commandments as obstacles to real freedom, imposed by some tyrant who just wants to be in control. But Jesus casts the commandments in the context of love. He does not insist on any obligation to follow them; rather, he says that whoever observes his commandments "is the one who loves me. "Jesus said the two greatest commandments are to 'love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind, "and to 'love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt 22:37-39)—even the commands he gives us are rooted in love, not legalism.

When we truly love someone, we desire to make them happy. Thus, following his commandments ultimately makes us happy too. Understood in these terms, the commandments don t'stifle us, they satisfy us! God doesn t'restrict our freedom; he respects it. Ultimately, it is our choice whether or not we will live the life of love that Jesus offers us.
