RECONCILIATION

True reconciliation is emotional, dramatic, and cleansing. When two people meet heart to heart and work through old hurts, misunderstandings, and careless words, cleansing tears often flow and the encounter ends with an embrace that fills both with the warmth of a love too strong to fade.

The readings this weekend assure us of this healthy release that comes with reconciliation. They give us the courage to reach out to someone with whom we need to reconcile ourselves, and give us the courage to ask for forgiveness from God, too.

In the reading from Exodus, we see how God refuses again and again to give up on the Israelites. Even though they grow impatient with God and turn to false idols, God still calls them back. Luke's Gospel assures us that God rejoices when we turn away from sin. Paul's letter to Timothy encourages us, like Paul, to look back on our lives and recognize where God's patient mercy has been shown to us.

Confirmation will be held on October 30th at 4PM. The choir has grown into an ensemble of 36 people who truly love singing in parts, experiencing community and using their talents to praise God. It's a win, win, win situation.

Liturgy Corner: Did You Know? Gestures

Bowing, kissing, genuflecting, and incensing are reverencing gesture used during liturgy.

Bowing is the ordinary gesture used to reverence the altar.

However, at the beginning and end of Mass, the priest and deacon reverence the altar with a kiss. The Book of the Gospels or *Evangelary* is also due reverence with a kiss.

Genuflection, the touching of the right knee to the ground, is the proper gesture used before the Blessed Sacrament. The presiding priest genuflects right after the consecration, and all should genuflect when approaching the tabernacle.

Incensing is optional and is used to show particularly solemn respect for any object or person during liturgical celebration. Examples of its use include reverencing the paschal candle at the Easter Vigil or the body of the deceased at a funeral.

The unity of the assembly is reflected as we assuming a common posture. We stand as a sign of reverence (e.g. communion); we sit to listen Scriptures, homily); and we kneel when we are in a penitential mode (Penitential Rite)

Although the universal posture for the Eucharistic Prayer is standing, some bishops have asked us to kneel during this time.

During the sign of peace we stand and no special gesture is prescribed. We are simply directed to offer each other a sign of peace.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at (570-862-7551) or to Diocesan officials, including the Vicar General, Monsignor Thomas M. Muldowney, V.G., at (570-207-2269).
