Message of the Week

Mark 9:30-37

"Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me." For many people, "receiving" a child is part of their daily routine. Those of us who are parents obviously welcome children into our families and continue to serve them throughout their lives. Grandparents, siblings, other relatives, foster parents, and sometimes neighbors and friends also make room in their homes and their hearts to welcome the children of God has placed in their circle. Teachers, physicians, therapists, and others who work with children on a professional level are also in the "business" of receiving children. How wonderful to thing that all of this normal activity can offer us the opportunity to encounter Christ!

Because dealing with children can become routine, or at times can even be filled with challenges and frustrations, we might need to pause to remind ourselves about the blessings that they bring. Certainly their joy and innocence is a gift in itself, but in today's Gospel we are reminded that their presence brings more than that. When we serve children in a spirit of generosity, when we "receive" them as they are – with all that entails – we are in turn receiving Jesus...who first came to us as a child.

Altar

In the early church, the altar was a simple and free-standing table or block of stone as it is today. During the Middle Ages, as the various ministries such as deacon, cantor, and lector died out and the priest took on all ministerial responsibilities, the altar became a utilitarian shelf protruding from a huge piece of wall art called a *reredos* or *retable*. Today, the various ministries have been restored, and each minister has his own place from which to function. The altar has once again become a simple and free-standing structure with but one use. It is the table whereupon the Sacrifice of the Cross is made present under signs of bread and wine, the central place of our thanksgiving, our Eucharist. The proper gesture by which one

Parenting Pointers

5 steps to getting kids to obey:

Step 1 Get the child's attention. (Get close, look them in the face and make sure they are looking at you.)

Step 2 Give a short, clear direction.

Step 3 Make sure they understand your direction by asking them to repeat it back to you. (More next week)

Step 4 If the child does not obey the first time you give the direction, repeat it once and add what the consequence will be for non-compliance (for example, time-out, loss of a privilege, etc).Step 5 If the child does not obey, calmly and immediately enforce the consequence. No yelling, no negotiating. JUST DO IT.
