#### Message of the Week Mark 12:38-44

Jesus explains that the widow's tiny sum was generous in a way that the larger amounts people gave were not. The poor widow "contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." She was truly generous, giving what cost her dearly. Her contribution was made out of love, not just out of obligation or for the sake of show.

God has given us all different "livelihoods." Some of us have more money, more talents, more resources. Some of us have less. But of course we know that God's love for us is not based on this external data. He loves the rich and the poor alike. The question is whether this external data affects our love for God? Jesus' message challenges us *all* today to gratefully give back to God in thanks for whatever he has given us, be it small or great. We are called not to give from our surplus but to share from our very livelihood. That is to say, we are called to acknowledge that our livelihood itself, no matter the details, is a gift from God.

#### Flu Shots are available

Flu Season is the worst. Beat that forecast. For 2014-2015, ACIP (Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices- United States) recommends: All persons, > 6 months should receive influenza vaccines annually who do not have contraindications. Influenza vaccinations should not be delayed to procure a specific vaccine preparation if an appropriate one is already available. Vaccination optimally should occur before onset of influenza activity in the community. Vaccination should be offer as long as influenza viruses are circulating. Who should get the flu shot? Anyone who wants protection for the flu. Anyone in contact with small children. Anyone with chronic health conditions. All person 6 months and older. Women who are or will be pregnant during the flu season.

#### Liturgy Corner: DID YOU KNOW?

#### Liturgical Books

There are many liturgical books in our church's sacristies, but the ones we see must frequently are the Lectionary, the Roman Missal, and the Book of the Gospels.

The Lectionary contains al the scripture texts including the first and second readings, the gospel readings, the responsorial psalm, and the gospel acclamation verse.

The Roman Missal contains all of the prayers offered by the presiding celebrant and all of the instructions (rubrics) he needs to celebrate correctly.

The Book of the Gospels or Evangelary contains only the gospel readings and is usually a large and beautiful volume. Most revered of all the books, it may be carried in procession, enthroned upon the altar, kissed and incensed.

The Lectionary and Missal are used in every community at every Mass. The Book of the Gospels is used in some parishes every Sunday, while some save it for use only on special occasions or during the festival seasons of Christmas Time and Easter Time.
