Flu Shots are available

Flu Season is the worst. Beat that forecast. For 2014-2015, ACIP (Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices- United States) recommends: All persons, > 6 months should receive influenza vaccines annually who do not have contraindications. Influenza vaccinations should not be delayed to procure a specific vaccine preparation if an appropriate one is already available. Vaccination optimally should occur before onset of influenza activity in the community. Vaccination should be offer as long as influenza viruses are circulating Anyone who wants protection for the flu, should get the shot. Anyone in contact with small children, chronic health conditions. All person 6 months and older. Women who are or will be pregnant during the flu season.
