Flu Shots Checklist #1 - Clean Your Screen .

I don't have to tell you that germs lurk on every doorknob, light switch, and keyboard you touch. That's why it's a good idea to clean such surfaces regularly. But many of us forget to disinfect the one thing we keep in our hands – and against our faces – all the time our cell phone. One 2013 analysis found that some smartphones may harbor more bacteria than a toilet seat!!!
