Message of the Week

Mark 9:2-10

Perhaps we can relate in some small way to this Transfiguration experience. Perhaps there has been a time or two in our lives when we have had a spiritual experience, when we experienced God's healing, felt his mercy, or knew his presence was real. But then, maybe it went away. For most of us, we don't spend the majority of our time "on the mountaintop" with these "dazzling" insights into who God is. Rather, we tend to walk a journey that is shrouded by mystery and dependent upon faith. At times, we may even second-guess the spiritual experiences of our past once they have "disappeared." Possibly Peter, James, and John wondered if it had all been a crazy illusion. But when the Resurrection happened, they knew it was all for real. As we await the Resurrection this Lent, may we have the faith to believe that Jesus really has touched our lives and that he can lead us to eternal life.

JUSTICE NOTES:

As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone ---Mark 9: 9

Picture this: You have just experienced the most incredible transformation of your beloved leader on a high mountain and now you are being told to keep it to yourself. In this Second Sunday of Lent, we are reminded of our role and responsibilities as members of the Church---a role to remain faithful, a role to "listen up!" to the teachings of Jesus, and a responsibility to live our life in covenant with God. What are we called to do in "coming down from the mountain," in working in the nitty-gritty reality of daily life?

Saint Pope John Paul II states in Redemptoris Missio, "The entire people of God have a role to play as the Church fulfills her mission. In various ways and through every member according to the gifts and the manner of acting proper to each vocation, the people of God must respond to the duty to proclaim and bear witness to the Gospel (cf.1 Cor 9: 16), in the awareness that 'missionary activity is a matter for all Christians." (538). As lay people we are especially called to transform the world. If you have any doubt about this, read the Vatican II document, "Decree on the Apostolate of Lay People," where Christian social action is preeminent as the responsibility of the laity (7). Participating in missionary activity does not mean that you have to go to some far-off country (although it could mean that for some of you). It does mean that you have to be willing to go beyond the walls of the church to walk in the larger community of humankind.

As Pope Francis states, more recently, in his exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel (Evangelii Gaudium), "Today, missionary activity still represents the greatest challenge for the Church"[15] and "the missionary task must remain foremost".[16] What would happen if we were to take these words seriously? We would realize that missionary outreach is paradigmatic for all the Church's activity. Along these lines the Latin American bishops stated that we "cannot passively and calmly wait in our church buildings"; [17] we need to move "from a pastoral ministry of mere

Ways to Evangelize During Lent Abstinence: So why aren't you eating pepperoni pizza on Friday?

You love pepperoni pizza. You eat it all the time. Suddenly, you can't have it on Friday?! What could possibly be going on? It must be that Catholic thing, again. Absolutely! On Fridays during Lent, we particularly remember the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. In memory of this great sacrifice, we continue the tradition of penance and sacrifice – abstaining from meat on Fridays in an outward manifestation of an interior reality: the conversion of our hearts. As Saint John Paul III has said, "In fact, the external aspects of fasting, though important, do not convey the full measure of the practice. Joined to the practice should be a sincere desire for inner purification, readiness to obey the divine will and thoughtful solidarity with our brothers and sisters, especially the very poor." Christ himself fasted and prayed in

the desert. Through fasting and praying, we unite ourselves with the sacrifice of Christ and offer him reparation for our sins and failings. It's a little thing to give him in the face of his ultimate sacrifice, but what a grace that our God accepts and loves little gifts!
