Ministers of Hospitality

In the past, we called them ushers and certainly didn't think of them as ministers. They were men who found us seats, took up the collection, and made sure we all got to communion in an orderly fashion.

Ministers of hospitality still do those things among others, and women as well as young people have joined the ranks.

They greet us warmly, take care that we are comfortable, help us with emergencies that may arise, and cheerfully bid us farewell.

They welcome new-comers and, in some parishes, are responsible for post-liturgical social gatherings that help further the bond of the community.

A ministry of hospitality can be whatever a parish envisions for it. It starts for the purpose of welcoming people to church but can grow into any number of outreach activities that develop out of that community's experience of word and sacrament.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (Childline) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations.
