Christians around the world are mourning the death of Pope Francis, the first Latin American pontiff, who died Monday morning (April 21) at the age of 88.

His gestures—from tenderly embracing the sick to repeatedly visiting prisoners touched millions of hearts. He also transformed the image of the papacy into a pastoral ministry based on personal encounters and strong convictions about poverty, mission and dialogue.

Pope Francis "taught us to live the values of the Gospel with fidelity, courage, and universal love, especially in favor of the poorest and most marginalized".

Pope Francis was often practical and even poetic when speaking about family life, the environment and ministry in the church.

Elected in 2013, Pope Francis first greeted the world from St. Peter's Basilica as Bishop of Rome. In his final weeks, he did the same, surprising the faithful with appearances across Rome despite fragile health.

On Easter, he gave his final "Urbi et Orbi" blessing and rode the popemobile one final time.

As per his wishes, he'll be buried near the Marian icon he visited often at the Basilica of St. Mary Major.



Second Sunday of Easter (or Sunday of Divine Mercy)

First Reading: Acts 5:12-16

The people held the apostles in great esteem and brought sick people to them to be healed. Although some were afraid to be known, the number of Jesus' followers continued to grow steadily.

Second Reading: Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19

John depicts a vision of lamp-stands of gold and one like the Son of Man in a robe with a sash of gold. This apparition told John he had nothing to fear and then described himself as one who was dead but now lived again. He then instructed John to record any other visions he might have.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

Jesus appeared to the disciples and breathed on them saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit." He gives them the power to forgive people's sins or hold them accountable. Thomas, who was not present, refused to believe Jesus had appeared until he came to them once more. Jesus told Thomas to believe and added, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

"Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said: 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. And bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe.' Thomas answered and said to him, 'My Lord and my God!' ... 'Blessed are those who have not seen but believed.'"

Is there a Thomas in me? Does my faith allow me to celebrate the most important fact that Jesus died, arose and lives? By His passion, death and resurrection, we too share in the newness of life. We reach out to Jesus as did Thomas. We unlock the doors of our unbelief and allow Him to touch us with His saving grace in a special way on this Divine Mercy Sunday. Touched by the Lord, we bring that gift to others. 'Jesus I trust in you.'

MINISTRY OF THE MONTH APRIL

Each month, a Ministry of the parish is highlighted. For April our focus will be on the beauty of lay ministry in the Mass

This cannot be said too many times – a Parish needs a vibrant community to survive. So take the opportunity in reflective silence and seriously consider being an active Lay Ministry participant. This will lead you to a life of deeper and strengthening faith.
