Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (Childline) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551 or to Diocesan officials, including the Vicar General, Monsignor Thomas M. Muldowney, V. G., at 570-207-2269.

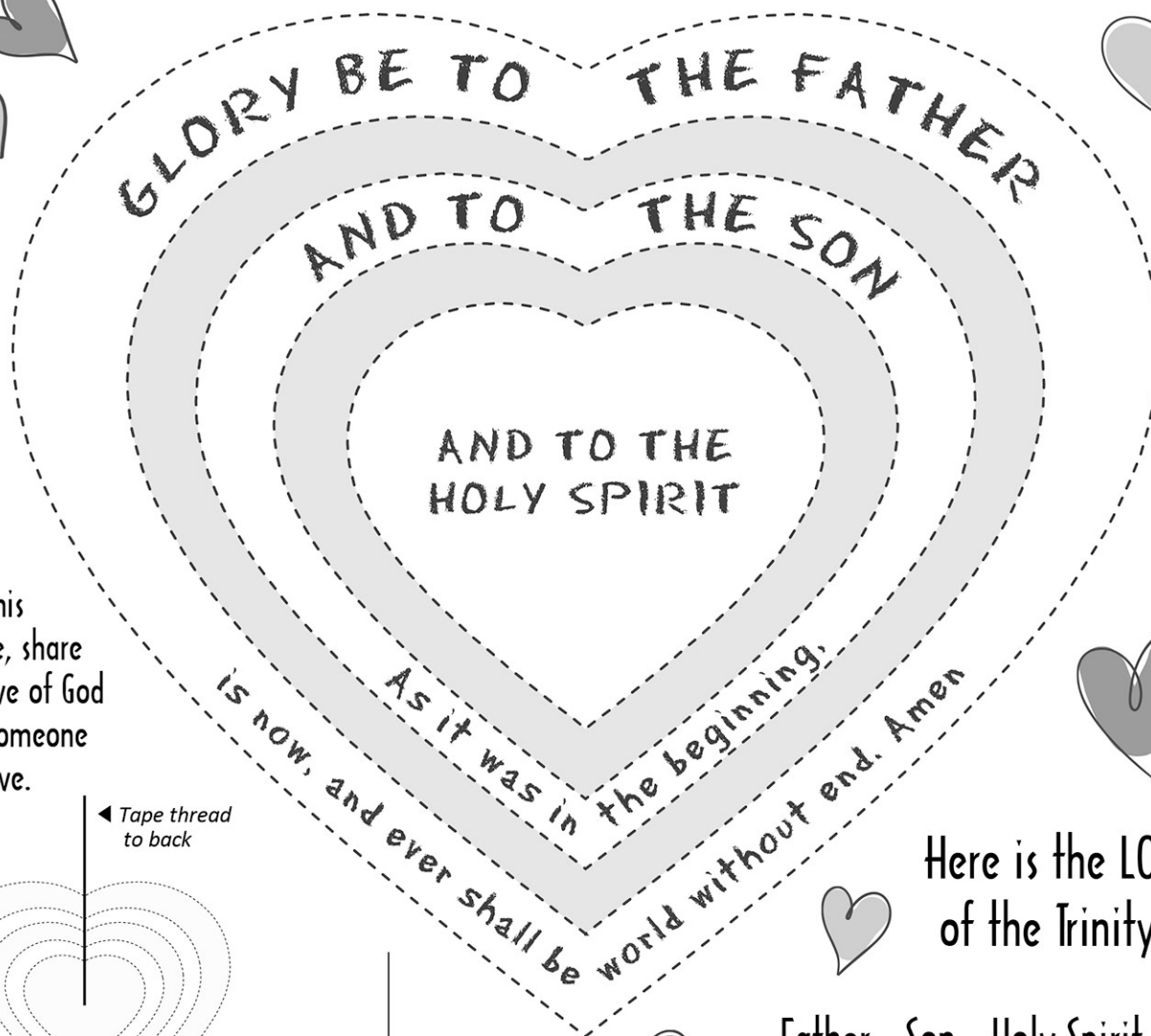

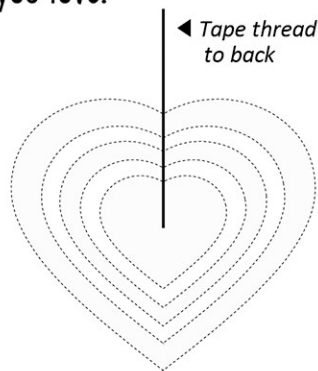
The Most Holy Trinity | John 3:16-18

◀ Tape thread to back

Here is the LOVE of the Trinity...

Father - Son - Holy Spirit
1 unit, 3 parts!

Color each of the 3 hearts with text --
Cut on dotted line (you should have 3 separate hearts).

Turn upside down (back facing up) and nest them together.

Cut a piece of thread 12-18 inches long and **tape** to top back of each heart, starting with the smallest and ending with thread at the top for hanging.
