Message of the Week Mark 5:21-43

Jesus wasn't concerned about what others thought. And lest we imagine that everyone around him was constantly worshiping him and adoring his divinity, today's reading reminds us that even in the presence of the Lord, skeptics were a dime a dozen. So should we be surprised if we must deal with a bit of ridicule ourselves?

As faithful Christians, we will at times be called to chart a course that doesn't make sense in the eyes of the world. And, yes, some people will say we're crazy. We may be called to take a stand for the unborn or the elderly in a culture that considers life to be expendable. We may be faced with a decision at work that requires us to adhere to an ethical code that our boss thinks is laughable. Perhaps we will have to sacrifice a relationship because of pressures to ignore Christian morality. Or maybe the situation that arise when we say a prayer before eating at a restaurant. Whether we face a snicker or blatant discrimination against our religious freedom, we should not flinch or waver when such oppositions comes our way. Jesus faced it and so will we. The question is only how we will respond.

FR. B'S FAREWELL MESSAGE:

It is with a deep sense of appreciation that I am leaving the Parish of SS. Peter & Paul. Eighteen months ago (January 15, 2014) I began my relationship with St. Pete's Parish and never foresaw a move on my horizon (except to retire or to respond to a summons from the Lord!). Despite being happy and comfortable as Pastor at SS. Peter & Paul Parish, I became aware of a need in Monroe County. Bishop Bambera was faced with four Pastoral openings, each with their own particular pastoral needs. Only one of these openings was anticipated. I told him that while happy and content here, if I could help, I would apply so as to help him meet the pastoral needs of Monroe County.

You may ask: "Aren't the pastoral needs of SS. Peter & Paul Parish just as important?" Of course they are – there is no question about it. However, each parish has needs peculiar to itself. The Parish of the Most Holy Trinity has the need of a priest who can speak Spanish and also can serve the Polish Immigrants in Monroe County. I began the Ministry to the Latinos in Hazleton and in Monroe County many years ago, so I am familiar with many of their needs. I was also pastor of one of the parishes that merged to become Most Holy Trinity.

There are many priests who could serve the Pastoral Needs of SS. Peter & Paul Parish - men who might be more effective Pastors; more open to the Holy Spirit's direction; more aware of the ways to embrace the New Evangelization in St. Pete's; more knowledgeable of the financial operations and the capital improvements that are needed; more empowering and directive. I pray that whomever Bishop Bambera appoints as the next Pastor of SS. Peter and Paul Parish will bring the Good News of Jesus Christ in a vibrant and meaningful manner.

I am thankful for the welcome I received and for the many kindnesses shown me while at SS. Peter & Paul Parish. The prayers and support of the people are necessary if a priest is to serve as the Lord calls. I ask for your prayers as I begin a new adventure as a priest – not only helping to build community, but also to build buildings! With prayer and the Lord's guidance I know the challenge will be met.

I ask for forgiveness for those who felt I did not serve them as well as they anticipated or hoped I would. I ask forgiveness for those whom I have offended by my lack of compassion or understanding. I ask forgiveness for being

unavailable when needed. Most of all, I ask for your prayers that I may be the priest that Jesus has called me to be.

The priest is not an angel sent from heaven He is a man Chosen from among men, A member of the Church, A Christian. Remaining man and Christian. He begins to speak of you The Word of God. The word is not his own. No. he comes to you Because God has told him To proclaim God's Word. Perhaps he has not entirely Understood it himself. Perhaps he adulterates it. But he believes, And despite his fear He knows he must communicate God's Word to you. For must not some of us Say something about God, About eternal life; About the majesty of grace *In our sanctified being?* Must not some one of us Speak of sin, The judgment and mercy of God? So, my dear friends, Pray for him, Carry him, So that he might be able To sustain others by bringing to them The mystery of God's love Revealed in Jesus Christ.
