First Reading: Wisdom 1:13-15 2:23-24

This reading relates how death of the spirit entered the world by the envy of the devil, but those not in his possession will not experience it.

His Word Today by Rev. William J. Reilly Thirteen Sunday in Ordinary Time July 1, 2018

In your kindness watch over migrants, refugees and asylum seekers.

"But God formed man to be imperishable; the image of his own nature he made him. But by the envy of the devil, death entered the world, and they who belong to his company experience it... he took the child by the hand and said to her... 'Little girl, I say to you arise!' The girl of a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At this they were utterly amazed."

We have been told from the first book of the bible that we are made in the image and likeness of God. We have been offered the gift of life and we strive to preserve life in all its forms. The late Cardinal Berardin of Chicago called us to have a 'consistent ethic of life.' He teaches us as Catholics that we are opposed to abortion, capital punishment, nuclear war and euthanasia. Were he alive today, I am sure he would include immigrant persecution and ask us to prayer for those seeking asylum. Why?

A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP BAMBERA



As you may already know from media reports, the Diocese of Scranton has been the subject of a statewide Grand Jury investigating child sexual abuse in six of the eight dioceses in Pennsylvania. Public release of the report is expected in the coming weeks.

I want to take this opportunity to offer my deepest apologies to the victims of such abuse, to their families, to the faithful of our Church and to everyone impacted by the behaviors described in this report. While difficult to facer this is the only way for us to move forward in a more positive way as we learn from the past.

You will be kept apprised of new developments through various channels of communication as more information is released. Once again, I am deeply sorry for these past actions and the pain caused by the behaviors described in the report, and I will continue to do all that I can to ensure the safety and well-being of our children.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor
