Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

This passage about the failure of the Lord's vineyard is a metaphor for the ingratitude of the people of Israel and Judah. In tones of sadness and rebuke, the Lord asks, "What more was there to do for my vineyard?"

Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9

In a moving appeal to the Philippians, Paul exhorts them to embrace all that is pure, decent, and admirable; then God's peace will be theirs.

Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

In another rebuke to the chief priests and the elders, Jesus recounts a parable in which the owner of a vineyard leases his vineyard to tenant farmers. When the owner sends his servants and even his son to claim his rightful share of the crops, the tenants kill all of them. With some bitterness, Jesus warns the chief priests that "the Kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to people that will yield a rich harvest.

His Word Today by Rev. William J. Reilly

"Brothers and sisters. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."... "What more was there to do for my vineyard that I had not done?"

The two verses of scripture today provide a prescription for our prayer life, as our response for all that the Lord has done for us. What more could He have done? Out of love and concern God sent Jesus to restore a broken world, like the sour grapes, to a loving relationship with the Father. He has done everything. Now our response.

Our prayer life begins with thanksgiving because of what He has and continues to do. Our prayer life consists of an 'attitude of gratitude.' As we discover His abiding presence with us. We need not go searching; the Lord is here, and now. The Lord wants us to ask, our petition, as we express both our need and dependence. When we approach God in prayer with joy and confidence, the fruit will be His peace. When we read what was written before, remember the words ACTS —

Adoration, Contrition, Thanksgiving, Supplication

Lord, I am aware of your goodness to me and offer myself to you.

O God,
We thank you for this earth,
our home; for the wide sky
and the blessed sun,
for the ocean and streams,
for the towering hills
and the whispering wind,
for the trees and green grass.

We thank you for our senses
by which we hear
the songs of birds,
and see the splendor of fields
of golden wheat,
and taste autumn's fruit,
rejoice in the feel of snow,
and smell
the breath of spring flowers.

Grant us a heart opened wide to all this beauty; and save us from being so blind that we pass unseeing when even the common thornbush is aflame with your glory.

For each new dawn
Is filled with infinite possibilities
for new beginnings
and new discoveries.
Life is constantly changing
and renewing itself.
In this new day
of new beginnings with God,
all things are possible.
We are restored and renewed
in a joyous awakening
to the wonder
that our lives are and,
yet, can be. Amen

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor
