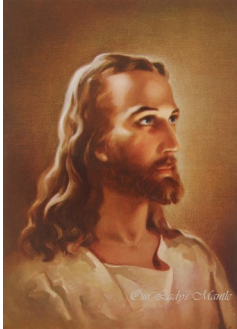

## THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### First Reading: Isaiah 8:23—9:3

The prophet Isaiah describes the anguish of a conquered people, but he promises that they will triumph and will see a great light as on the “day of Midian.”

### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17

Paul speaks to the Corinthians with both anger and indignation because they are quarreling among themselves as to whom they should show allegiance. Some wish to follow Paul; some, Peter; others Apollos; others, Christ.

### Gospel: Matthew 4:12-23

Jesus begins his mission by going to Capernaum, fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah. He selects Peter, Andrew, James and John as his disciples, inviting them to be “fishers of men.”

### Third Sunday in Ordinary Time January 22, 2023

**“From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, ‘Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.’ As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, ‘Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.’”**

The message of Jesus, as we read at the beginning of His ministry, is simple and clear: repentance and acceptance of the kingdom He came to establish. The invitation to Simon and Andrew, is His invitation to me again today. He has a plan and a task for me. Why am I so slow to see the urgency of His call? As we look at the world around us, broken and in need of Him, we are summoned to respond. If we wait for the next person to respond valuable time will be lost. Please put a name and face in your prayer, for someone surely is awaiting your response and action.

## **For second consecutive year, Diocese of Scranton receives top score in independent financial transparency report**

SCRANTON (Dec. 7, 2022) – For the second consecutive year, a lay organization of faithful Catholics has named the Diocese of Scranton as being one of the most financially transparent dioceses in the United States.

For six years, Voice of the Faithful has reviewed all U.S. Catholic dioceses' online financial transparency. The group's 2022 report identifies the Diocese of Scranton as one of only five dioceses to receive an overall score of 100% in regards to transparency. This year's other top-scoring dioceses include Charleston, Lexington, Orlando and Rochester.

The Diocese of Scranton also received an overall score of 100% for financial transparency in 2021.

The Voice of the Faithful's sixth annual review of all dioceses was conducted between June 1 and Aug. 31 by three independent reviewers and their report, "Measuring and Ranking Diocesan Online Financial Transparency: 2022 Report," was released on Nov. 28, 2022.

In addition to receiving a perfect score in the report, the Diocese of Scranton and its website was highlighted as having one of the best finance pages. The report indicates the Diocese of Scranton's finance page stands out from others with "key financial information easily accessible."

"I am happy to report for the second year that the Diocese of Scranton is being recognized for its commitment to financial transparency," the Most Rev. Joseph C. Bambera, Diocese of Scranton, said. "Each one of us is a steward of the resources given to us by God and we all share in the mission of making sure they are used responsibly. By having easy access to financial reports, policies and procedures, every parishioner can see that the money donated to the diocese goes exactly where it is intended."

Voice of the Faithful scores dioceses' financial transparency practices on a scale from zero to 100. The organization awards each diocese points for publishing a variety of financial documents, including audited financial reports, information about the diocese's cathedratium (tax collected from individual parishes) and a current list of members on the diocesan finance council.

Information on the Diocese of Scranton's financial policies and guidelines, audited financial reports and finance council members can be found at [dioceseofscranton.org/directory/offices/financial-services](http://dioceseofscranton.org/directory/offices/financial-services).

The Voice of the Faithful's 2022 report shows that overall, diocesan online financial transparency scores increased from 69% in 2021 to 70% in 2022.

Voice of the Faithful 2022 reviewers concluded that, "Although significant progress in financial transparency has been achieved in the last decade, and in particular during the last three years, members of the Church in the U.S. must be vigilant if they wish to prevent financial mismanagement and abuse."

## Understanding Your Parish Financial Report

### Revenue

- ♦ **Collection** includes all offertory envelopes, online giving and loose collections.
- ♦ **Faith Formation Fees** includes all registration and program fees, adults and children.
- ♦ **Fundraising/Development** includes any gifts or donations that are not regular offertory, bequests, memorials, parish activities and any parish rebate from the Diocesan Annual Appeal (75% over goal is refunded to the parish.)
- ♦ **Other Income** includes rental of facilities, insurance refunds, interest income, sale of assets, funerals/weddings perquisites and any other income.
- ♦ **Designated Income/Grants/PPP Loans** includes donations or grants specifically earmarked for a designated purpose and any Paycheck Protection Plan grant income.
- ♦ **Transfers Saving Account/Other** includes transfers from bank accounts that are excluded from operating income or have already been reported as operating income.
- ♦ **Diocesan Special Collections** are collections which are remitted back to the Diocese. (Care & Education of Priests, Emergency collections following a natural disaster, Retired Religious Collection, Catholic Communications, and all others).

### Expenses

- ♦ **Administration** includes clergy salary and benefits, office staff salary and benefits, administrative expenses, office expenses and the Cathedraicum (9.5% parish assessment to the Diocese) and Clergy Care and Wellness Assessment.
- ♦ **Rectory** expenses include the cost to run and maintain the rectory, as well as household expenses for the pastor.
- ♦ **Liturgy** includes salaries & benefits for musicians & sacristans. Also all supplies (printed materials, candles, decorations, flowers, ect)
- ♦ **Faith Formation** includes salaries and benefits of the faith formation staff, cost of textbooks, supplies and retreats
- ♦ **Social Justice** includes all social justice salaries and benefits, as well as the cost of all social justice expenses.
- ♦ **Operation & Maintenance** of Plant includes salaries and benefits of all maintenance staff and electricity, heat, water, cleaning janitorial, repairs and maintenance, and any plant and maintenance supplies.
- ♦ **Fixed Expense** includes insurance premiums from the Diocesan self-insured program for property, liability and worker
- ♦ **Debt Service** includes the interest and principal payments paid on outstanding parish debt.
- ♦ **Capital Outlays** includes any major repairs on the parish building or site or any new construction costs.
- ♦ **Designated Expenses/Transfers Out** includes all expenses designated for a specific purpose or transfers out to saving/building fund.
- ♦ **Catholic School Assessments** represent the parish's portion allocated for the support of the Diocese of Scranton Catholic School System which are 14.5% for a parish with a Catholic School in its county and 8% if there is no school in its county.
- ♦ **Diocesan Special Collections Remittance** are the remittals of the Diocesan collections above.

### Parish Surplus/"(Deficit) - CASH Basis

- ♦ This line represents the **increase** or **decrease** in parish cash balances from the beginning of the year to the end of the year on a **CASH BASIS** based on actual expenses paid.

### (Increase )/Decrease in Unpaid Diocesan Obligations

- ♦ This amount represents the change in the parish's unpaid obligations over the year. If there is an **increase** in unpaid obligations, this number will be **negative**. If the parish **reduced** its unpaid obligations, this will be a **positive** number.

### Actual Parish Net Surplus/ Deficit

- ♦ This value is the sum of the parish Surplus/(Deficit) and the (Increase/Decrease of Unpaid Diocesan Obligations. The cash balance represents the net affect of operating activity on a cash basis. If the parish is current on all of its obligation, there is no difference between the Cash and ACTUAL Parish Net Surplus/(Deficit). However, if a parish is unable to stay current on its obligations, the increase of unpaid obligations will reduce their CASH Basis Net Surplus/(Deficit) by the amount of the increase in unpaid Diocesan obligations.

**This Actual Parish Net Surplus/(Deficit) reflects a parish's true ability to pay its current obligations.**

### Outstanding Diocesan Obligations

- ♦ This section highlights the change in a parish's unpaid Diocesan obligations over each fiscal year. If a parish has an increase in unpaid obligations for the year, this will result in a lower Actual Parish Net Surplus/(Deficit) as these are an annual obligation of the parish that was not paid in the current year.

### Diocesan Loan/Debt

- ♦ This is the amount of outstanding loans of the parish.
