





PARISH CEMETERIES UPDATE

As the spring weather begins, and we look towards a great summer, one annual concern is the upkeep of our Parish cemeteries. As it stands, we have five cemeteries (Sts. Peter & Paul, Sacred Heart, St. Francis, St. Joseph, & St. Dominic) and we do not have any cemetery staff. We rely on a costly contracted service to cut the grass at each cemetery during a 6 month period.

Please keep in mind that anything other than that costly contracted service, we only have one groundskeeper to take care of the four buildings and grounds at Sts. Peter & Paul church, the two at St. Dominic, in addition to the five parish cemeteries. After a burial, we need to allow the ground to settle. Digging a hole and burying something foreign in the ground naturally causes the ground to settle and form holes around the object. This is an annual and natural occurrence. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we only have one person to maintain the five cemeteries, dealing with the settling ground, inclement weather, and other obstacles. The only way we are able to fill in the holes is with the church's one pickup truck, which cannot physically get to every single grave, so most of it is done by hand. In addition to the settling ground, please keep in mind that any seasonal items/decorations on graves need to be removed or they will be disposed of (which adds more time and maintenance to the groundskeeper). Adding additional stones/statues around a grave also makes upkeep and grass cutting more difficult. One other thing that has been brought up is people leaving beer cans on graves, which is not permitted, so please refrain from doing so. For these reasons, we have added a cemetery envelope every month. It is one of the greatest needs we're facing right now. If anybody is interested in offering help with care and maintenance, we will gladly accept all help.


Lectors

PENTECOST SUNDAY

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

During the Feast of Pentecost, tongues of fire came to rest on the heads of the disciples and they were filled with the Holy Spirit. Each disciple began speaking in a different language, and were understood by people from many different regions who were amazed at what they had witnessed.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

Paul explains that we are all members of one body. We have all been baptized in one Spirit and although numerous, we are one through Christ.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS **HIS WORD TODAY** by Rev. William J. Reilly

Pentecost Sunday May 23, 2021

"I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming."

One of the questions asked in the early church was 'have you received the Holy Spirit?' 'We have not heard of the Holy Spirit, how can we?'

We are asked today if we have been born again. Our answer is 'yes' as the Holy Spirit came to dwell in us at our baptism. The Holy Spirit fills us at confirmation. And today we are given the promise, 'he will guide you to all truth.'

We all need guides. When we observe a blind person being safely led by a seeing eye dog, we admire the skill and the dependence. When some heroic action takes place, a rescue from a fire or accident, we marvel at what takes place. A GPS leads people to a destination. Am I able to discover the power of the Holy Spirit at work in me as I live out what I believe? Will I let the Spirit guide me in my decisions, great and small?

The Spirit of Pentecost is present among us today. We ask that we allow it to work in and through us.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24 hour Child Abuse hotline (Childline) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary B Pacuska at 570-862-7551
