FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 66:10-14c

Isaiah instructs the people of Jerusalem to rejoice, because God would restore her prosperity. The people will better understand God's power through their homeland's restoration.

Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18

Paul describes the sign of the cross of Jesus as all that is significant. Following the old laws is unimportant. Instead, being baptized in Christ and adhering to his ideals is what matters most.

Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach his good news, telling them "the harvest is rich, but the workers few." He also gave them detailed instructions on how to act towards the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.

"At that time Jesus appointed seventy two others, whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, 'the harvest is abundant but the laborers are few, so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

Before He ascended into heaven Jesus sent the apostles with the great commission. During His ministry He sent 36 pairs to prepare His way. The entire church today is sent on mission, to evangelize, to bring the Lord to others and assist others to discover His presence among them.

In our parishes we are sent to invite, to bring back the lapsed and to energize our entire community with the grace and presence of Jesus. Why? Because the mission of Jesus remains and we are called to bring what is still far to completion to others.

on some of our social justice Ministries


There are many today who are struggling. They may be any age or background. As a Parish community, we have 2 powerful Ministries to help people- a Food Pantry and Treasures, a clothing closet. Both Ministries are in need of donations and volunteers. None of us know if we will ever require one of these services, and it is comforting to know that they are available in our parish. The Gospel of Matthew tells us "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me. Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you? And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.' (Matthew 25: 35-40). When you help these ministries in any way you are able, you are also doing it for one of God's children. Never forget that.
