



The Sunday Good News

Church of Saints Peter & Paul

July 10, 2022



Father in heaven. *I* stand before You today in *Your omnipotent* presence to ask that You grant *me strength.* I want You to give me the strength to power through all of the tasks today whether little or bíg. It is by Your will that I live oh Lord. And I know it is also by Your will I will not go weak today.

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses petitions the people to follow the commandments God has set before them. He reminds them that the laws are not in the sky or far away at sea, but are accessible to them and meant to be followed if they wish to prosper.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

Paul discusses the divine nature of Jesus, and explains that Jesus was created before anything else. Everything else was "created through him, and for him."

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

While discussing everlasting life, a lawyer mentions loving one's neighbor as oneself. The lawyer then asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells him about a man beaten by robbers, who was ignored by both a priest and a Levite before a Samaritan stopped and offered him aid. Jesus asks the lawyer who was neighbor to the injured man. The lawyer says "the one who treated him with compassion." Jesus encourages him to go and do the same.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 10, 2022

"Moses said to the people: 'If only you would heed the voice of the Lord, your God, and keep his commandments and statutes that are written in the book of the law, when you return to the Lord, your God, with all your heart and all your soul...it is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out.""

I wonder if I can list the ten commandments. Do I realize they reflect the two great commands of Jesus to 'love God above all things and my neighbor as myself?' Can I discover in them all a single word to make sure I observe them? That word is 'respect.'

When we fail to put them into practice we weaken our relationship with Jesus, or even sometimes break that relationship completely. We have the great gift of reconciliation to restore the Christ life in us and assist us in our growth in holiness. The sacraments are the force which enable us to grow and resist sin and temptation.

There are many today who are struggling. They may be any age or background. As a Parish community, we have 2 powerful Ministries to help people- a Food Pantry and Treasures, a clothing closet. Both Ministries are in need of donations and volunteers. None of us know if we will ever require one of these services, and it is comforting to know that they are available in our parish. The Gospel of Matthew tells us "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me. Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you? And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.' (Matthew 25: 35-40). When you help these ministries in any way you are able, you are also doing it for one of God's children. Never forget that.

www.dioceseofscranton.org. All forms must be received by July 22, 2022.




Is your marriage going down the right road, or is it a little off track? Life can be difficult, as can the challenges you face in marriage.
