





SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 62:1-5

Isaiah prophesizes that Jerusalem will again be held in high esteem by God. He states that all nations will witness its glory. He compares a groom's joy toward his bride to the joy that God will feel toward Jerusalem.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

Paul discusses the different gifts and talents bestowed upon different individuals. He explains that each individual receives various talents so that everyone can contribute something to society.

Gospel: John 2:1-11

Jesus and Mary attended a wedding where Mary informed Jesus that there was no more wine. At first he said it did not concern him, but then he turned several jugs of water into wine. His disciples were also present, and believed in him more strongly after they witnessed the first sign of glory he revealed to them.

Gospel Today Second Sunday in Ordinary Time | John 2: 1-11

THE WEDDING <u>AT</u> CANA

On the third day there was a <u>wedding</u> in Cana in <u>Galilee</u>, and the mother of <u>Jesus</u> was there.

Jesus and his <u>disciples</u> were also invited to the wedding.

When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus <u>said</u> to him, "They have no wine." (And) Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come."

His <u>mother</u> said to the servers, "Do <u>whatever</u> he tells you."

Now there were <u>six stone</u> water jars there for <u>Jewish</u> ceremonial <u>washings, each holding</u> twenty to thirty <u>gallons</u>.

Jesus told them, "<u>Fill</u> the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some <u>out</u> now and take it to the <u>headwaiter</u>." So they took it.

And <u>when</u> the headwaiter tasted the <u>water</u> that had become <u>wine</u>, without knowing where it came from (although the <u>servers</u> <u>who</u> had drawn the water knew), the headwaiter called the <u>bridegroom</u> and said to him, "Everyone serves <u>good</u> wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until <u>now</u>."

Jesus did this as the <u>beginning</u> of his <u>signs</u> in <u>Cana</u> in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.




