

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5

The words of Isaiah urge all people to forsake war and to live in peace forever. The tone reaches a climax in the words, "One nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again."

Second Reading: Romans 13:11-14

Paul invites us to put away all the things of darkness and sin and to prepare for the coming of Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 24:37-44

A comparison is made between the destruction caused by the flood in Noah's time and the need to be prepared for the second coming of Christ. "You must be prepared in the same way. The Son of Man is coming at the time you least expect."

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

First Sunday of Advent November 27, 2022

"You know the time in which we are living, It is now the hour for you to wake from sleep, for our salvation is closer than when we first accepted the faith. The night is far spent; The day draws near. Let us cast off the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. Rather, put on the Lord Jesus..."

We have heard this message constantly as we begin the season of advent. What does it take to make sure that we respond? Consider the many horrible events of the past year. Mass shootings, innocent lives lost, families shattered by violence, war, and invasions since February, hate and indifference. They are not just distant happenings, they affect us.

This advent is our wake up call, asking us to consider what we do to contribute to the mess, and more importantly, what we will do to confront this reality. It is through the presence of Christ, the Prince of Peace that change can come. It is through our personal response to make change in our own lives, that there can be positive change for others. May these few weeks be profitable for us all.

Each month a Ministry of the parish is highlighted. For November we will reflect on the Ministry of Elder Care Outreach

We know there are many elder parishioners in our parish who are no longer able to attend our weekend Masses. For those with internet access, they are able to watch the live-streaming of Mass and so are able to join in the prayers and songs, hear the Scripture proclaimed and listen to the reflections and lessons of the homily.

Unfortunately, what they are not able to do is receive the Body and Blood of Jesus in Communion. And those without a computer are unable to view any of this.

All elder parishioners are invited to request the opportunity of receiving Communion regularly in their private homes and/or senior/nursing homes. Our primary focus of this ministry is <u>The Elder</u>, or <u>those younger</u> yet unable to leave their homes for Mass.

If you would like a Communion visit from one of our many Extraordinary Ministers of Communion every four to six weeks, please let us know this during the month of November so a schedule can be prepared.

COMMUNION VISIT AT HOME:

An Extraordinary Minister of Communion will call to make an appointment to visit you at your convenience.

The visit is usually 30 to 45 minutes and includes a brief sociable conversation about the current happenings in our parish followed by prayer together: hearing the Scripture of the Liturgical Season; offering some intentions and intercessions for our general and personal needs; praying the Our Father and the Lamb of God; the giving and receiving of the Eucharist with quiet moments for silent prayer afterwards
