Seventh Sunday of Easter or Ascension of the Lord May 21, 2023

"Then he approached and said to them, 'All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

The familiar 'Great Commission' of Jesus is so familiar and is directed to us personally. As we claim discipleship someone, an instrument of the Lord, carried out His mandate. The summary blessing calling on the creative Father, saving Son and sanctifying Spirit brought us into new life in the Lord.

The directive to the disciples in Galilee is repeated, as we accept our responsibility to be that 'someone' making other disciples, celebrating the sacraments with them and spreading the message of salvation, our personal relationship with Jesus Christ. But something has gone wrong. Many of us have failed to enthusiastically do our part to go and make disciples and teach by word and example.

Why are we afraid? Do we forget the promise that He is with us always? Think about the way you can carry out the mandate. How often we are told 'do not be afraid?' May we be reminded once again.

FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH MARELLO, Founder of the Congregation of the Oblates of St. Joseph, will be celebrated on **Wednesday evening**, **May 31**, at 7:00 p.m. in the Chapel of St. Joseph, 1880 Route 315, Laflin. The Mass will be offered in conjunction with its regular weekly Mass & Novena of St. Joseph. Guest celebrant and homilist will be Very Rev. Joseph G. Elston, V.F., Pastor of St. Joseph Marello Parish, Pittston. A social will follow the Mass, all are welcome to attend. St. Joseph Marello (1844-1895) was from the Asti region of Italy where he served as a diocesan priest and bishop. He founded the Oblate Order in 1878, which now serves in 18 countries throughout the world. The Oblate priests have served in our diocese since 1929. St. Joseph Marello was canonized a saint of the Church in 2001 by Pope St. John Paul II.

Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24 hour Child Abuse hotline (Childline) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary B Pacuska at 570-862-7551
