

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel and told them if it did not please them to serve God, then they must decide who they would serve. The people claimed that God had brought them out of slavery and protected them on their journey. Therefore, they would serve, the Lord their God, and no one else.

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:21-32 or 5:2a, 25-32

Husbands and wives should love one another as Christ loved the Church. They should nourish and care for each other as Christ cared for the church. Through the union between the two, they become one.

Gospel: John 6:60-69

Many of Jesus' followers were still disturbed by his teaching of the living bread, which they could not yet fully understand. Jesus explained that the Spirit gives life, and flesh is unimportant. Some of the disciples decided to leave. Jesus asked if the Twelve also wanted to leave. Although they do not completely understand yet, they have enough faith in Jesus to stay because they believe he is God's holy one.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

“Jesus knew from the beginning the ones who would not believe and the one who would betray him. And he said, ‘For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father.’ As a result, many of his disciples returned to their former life and no longer accompanied him. Jesus then said to the Twelve, ‘Do you also want to leave?’ Simon Peter answered him, ‘Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.’”

We conclude the reflection on the Eucharist from the gospel of John. We can picture those who stayed, as they took very seriously the teaching of Jesus, the ‘Bread of Life.’ We believe in His real presence in the Eucharist, every mass is a miracle as simple bread and wine is transformed in the Body and Blood of Christ. He stays with us, as we turn to Him. How sad many do not recognize His Real Presence in the sacramental gift. May we with faith, reverence and devotion seek the Lord and the gift of Himself. May our ‘Amen’ become stronger during this year of the Eucharistic Revival.

For August we will discuss **Missionary Work***

When we hear the word Missionary, what usually comes to our minds is someone who travels to other countries to spread the Word of God. But we could all be Missionaries without leaving our homes or moving anywhere. We could be Missionaries right here in our homes, communities and living our everyday lives. This month, try to be mindful of God before you react. Be kind. Be understanding. At times when you would lose your patience, remember the patience Jesus has with us. If you get angry, or want to argue or gossip, think of the words of the Our Father- "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us". Now you may be asking what does any of this have to do with being a home Missionary? People notice kindness and patience, and it has a way of being contagious. Doing the work of God by just being the best person you can be shows those around you the value and rewards of Catholicism. And even though we have many distractions in our lives, always find some time to pray. The Missionaries we think of in other countries find ways to be a beacon of hope, and through this hope they learn of God. If you become that person of hope for those around you, they too will see God in you. "And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices" (Mark12:33). Try this for a month. You may find the true meaning of happiness and inner peace and the satisfaction of being a Missionary in your home.
