First Reading: Ezekiel 33:7-9

God has appointed the prophet as a watchman over his people. If he fails to give them warning against sin, he will be held responsible.

Second Reading: Romans 13:8-10

In this beautiful letter, Paul says that all commandments are contained in this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Gospel: Matthew 18:15-20

Jesus explains to his disciples how to respond to those who wrong them – with gentleness and practical wisdom. He promises that whenever "two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst."

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time September 10, 2023

"You, son of man, I have appointed watchman for the house of Israel; when you hear me say anything to you, you shall warn them for me...But if you warn the wicked, trying to turn him from his way, and he refuses to turn from his way, he shall die for his guilt, but you shall save yourself... Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another...love is the fulfillment of the law."

What a difference from talking about someone else, criticizing them, or correcting what it is that can do them spiritual harm. The watchmen for Ezechiel, is like a security guard, a police officer, smoke alarm, or dashboard warning light, calling attention to something dangerous or harmful. We avoid danger. As responsible people we cannot just turn the other way, but assist others to turn to do what is right.

Unfortunately, many follow the song or maxim 'doing it my way', rather than discovering what is the best way, His way, He who told us He is 'the way, the truth and the life.'

As we strive to be holy, we bring others with us, the debt we owe to love others and live the way He wants. Don't close your eyes to what is wrong or harmful. Who are the two or 3 in your life?

"Change for Change" Baby Bottle Campaign

Providence Pregnancy Center is currently in the process of purchasing a ten-bedroom, six-bathroom property on almost an acre of property in Scranton. It has two houses for our maternity home and a separate office building that we plan to turn into a thrift store to help support this endeavor. We have been serving women and children in our diocese since December 2022. Our Center is currently located at 1738 Brick Avenue in Scranton. We are a nonprofit 501c3 Catholic organization that affirms the dignity of pregnant women and their children through compassionate support, practical help, and hope for the future. PPC supplies pregnant women with resources to help them throughout pregnancy and beyond: material assistance; community referrals; peer counseling; judgement-free confidential counseling for post-abortion healing; and soon we will be offering safe housing for pregnant moms and their children at our new location. All services are free of charge and open to all women.

Parish families will be given baby bottles to take home the weekend of September 9th & 10th. Everyone will have these bottles for three weeks. They are asked to place their loose change, bills, and/or checks into the bottles during that time period. Parish families are then asked to return their bottles to the parish on the designated dates (September 30th & October 1st).

DESIGNER BAG BINGO AT ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST




