

## TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

## First Reading: Wisdom 2:12, 17-20

Wicked people discuss their anger at the just one, because they do not like being reproached for their evil ways. They want to see if he is the Son of God, so they decide to torture him and see if God will come to defend him. They decide to condemn him to a shameful death and see if the claims are true that God will take care of him.

## Second Reading: James 3:16—4:3

James discusses the importance of avoiding jealousy and strife. People should strive for peace and justice instead of concentrating on material pleasures which can tempt people to sin to obtain whatever they desire.

#### Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

Jesus again attempts to prepare his disciples for his death and resurrection, although they do not yet fully understand. They had been arguing over who was the most important one, but Jesus tells them whoever wants to rank first must be willing to remain a servant to all. He also tells them that anyone who welcomes a child in his name welcomes both him and God.

"Beloved: Where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice. But the wisdom from above is first of all pure, then peaceable, gentle, compliant, full of mercy and good fruits, without inconstancy or insincerity. And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace for those who cultivate peace."

The teaching of Saint James' letter provides an excellent format for examining our conscience. Although we usually turn to the ten commandments or the beatitudes to evaluate our Christian lives, consider the virtues or gifts listed above. Think about someone you admire who possesses one or more of this litany of personal gifts. How many are mirrored by me, as I strive to grow in my Christian life?

As the days of political campaigning continue, how distant are we from the ideal presented by St. James? Hate, lies, name calling are the norm, not the needs and remedies we so desperately need.

Pope Francis often refers to cultivation, the process of working or addressing ways to improve. How well do I cultivate peace and avoid jealousy and selfish ambition?
