TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Ezekiel 18:25-28

Ezekiel reminds the people that if a sinner turns away from his iniquity, he will live, not die.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:1-11

Paul urges the converts at Philippi to be united in spirit and ideals, avoiding rivalry and dissension. He ends with the beautiful hymn extolling the humility and sacrifice of Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 21:28-32

Jesus speaks words of rebuke to the chief priests and the elders because they are not believing the teachings of John the Baptist. He warns them that tax collectors and prostitutes, who do believe John, will enter the Kingdom of God before them.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 1, 2023

"If there is any encouragement in Christ, any solace in love, any participation in the Spirit, any compassion and mercy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, with the same love, united in heart, thinking one thing. Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others."

As we reflect on this teaching of St. Paul, written perhaps only twenty years after the resurrection of Jesus, discover the model and pattern for living our faith. Reread the lengthy list of virtues to guide our every stepencouragement, love, compassion, mercy, unity, humility. These words are constantly repeated by Pope Francis in his weekly audiences. They are reminders of the building stones for families, parishes, and all Christian churches.

Paul sent his letter to a community, but I need to look into my heart to make sure I have these gifts for the good of my community.

While we have some great youth and young adults who participate in our parish through the Mass or activities, there are still so many of you that our parish desperately need. Jesus, along with His disciples, put themselves on the side to grow our faith into what it is today. They were young adults as they walked from city to city, proclaiming the Word. Saints Peter and Paul Parish updates regarding Communion visits to the Homebound and Persons with Disabilities

You may recall hearing a year ago last September of our desire to connect our Ministers of the Eucharist with Elders and Persons with Disabilities who are no longer able to attend Mass. The invitation has been well received. Currently there are eighteen Ministers of the Eucharist who have graciously offered to make Communion visits to over seventy-five homebound parishioners. Ordinarily a Minister of the Eucharist will make an appointment with the Elders according to their needs. Generally, the parishioner is visited at least once a month at a day and time convenient to them. Visits are made throughout all seven days of the week. In addition to homebound parishioners, Ministers of the Eucharist also visit local nursing homes with the same desire to bring Communion to the residents. These Communion Services are offered to any Catholic person who is a resident at the Home. Our Ministers serve Riverstreet Manor, North Penn, Wesley Village, Highland Park and Timber Ridge. Our Ministers also bring Communion to our parishioners who are hospitalized. If you or your Loved One would desire Communion brought to your home regularly, please contact Sister Madonna, sscm. You may call the parish office at 570-825-6663 and press 5 to be connected with her voicemail. Leave your name and phone number and Sister will return your call without delay. GOD longs to be with us as much as we long to be with GOD. This is an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist when you are no longer able to attend Mass.
