

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

This passage about the failure of the Lord's vineyard is a metaphor for the ingratitude of the people of Israel and Judah. In tones of sadness and rebuke, the Lord asks, "What more was there to do for my vineyard?"

Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9

In a moving appeal to the Philippians, Paul exhorts them to embrace all that is pure, decent, and admirable; then God's peace will be theirs.

Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

In another rebuke to the chief priests and the elders, Jesus recounts a parable in which the owner of a vineyard leases his vineyard to tenant farmers. When the owner sends his servants and even his son to claim his rightful share of the crops, the tenants kill all of them. With some bitterness, Jesus warns the chief priests that "the Kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to people that will yield a rich harvest.

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time October 8, 2023

"Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with Thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus...keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you."

When we receive a greeting card, we often hastily read the message, but respond with silent gratitude for the sender, their thoughtfulness in sharing their message with us. Consider this as you reread the message of St. Paul.

In offering encouragement to the Philippians, he exhorts them in their prayer to include, as all prayer should, both requests, gratitude and need. The fruit of prayer is the peace of God. As he completes this teaching he offers himself as a model as teacher and witness. The church asks us to accept Paul as a pattern and write our own message mirrored in the words he included in his card.

Each month, a Ministry of the parish is highlighted. For October we will focus on Youth and Young Adults

As we all know, everyone's time is extremely important. Many times we have so much to do and little time to do it. For our youth and young adults, this issue of time constraints is even more pronounced. There is school and all the work associated with it, in addition to outside activities and family chores. Young adults may be in school, getting married, beginning a new job, starting a family, and dealing with all of the stress associated with this. While we have some great youth and young adults who participate in our parish through the Mass or activities, there are still so many of you that our parish desperately need. Jesus, along with His disciples, put themselves on the side to grow our faith into what it is today. They were young adults as they walked from city to city, proclaiming the Word. Today, our Parish would greatly benefit by just giving a small portion of your time. The Church cannot grow without you.

One way of being involved is through liturgical ministries. We could use more altar servers (youth), cantors, lectors and Ministers of the Eucharist (young adults). There are activities in the next 6 months that can always use help. Come to the toy and/or purse bingo and lend a hand. Any of our cemeteries can be cleaned up, even for an hour. What great exercise! Our parish now has an Instagram account (saintspeterandpaulplains) in addition to Facebook. Something as simple as liking a post spreads the message to your friends and family.

Finally, as was mentioned at the beginning, everyone is stressed for time. If you are reading this, you probably attend Mass, and that is wonderful! But please consider giving a little bit of yourself so that our parish may grow. You are the future of the Catholic Church.

This cannot be said too many times – a Parish needs a vibrant community to survive. So take the opportunity in reflective silence and seriously consider being an active Lay Ministry participant. This will lead you to a life of deeper and strengthening faith.

Saints Peter and Paul Parish updates regarding Communion visits to the Homebound and Persons with Disabilities

You may recall hearing a year ago last September of our desire to connect our Ministers of the Eucharist with Elders and Persons with Disabilities who are no longer able to attend Mass. The invitation has been well received. Currently there are eighteen Ministers of the Eucharist who have graciously offered to make Communion visits to over seventy-five homebound parishioners. Ordinarily a Minister of the Eucharist will make an appointment with the Elders according to their needs. Generally, the parishioner is visited at least once a month at a day and time convenient to them. Visits are made throughout all seven days of the week. In addition to homebound parishioners, Ministers of the Eucharist also visit local nursing homes with the same desire to bring Communion to the residents. These Communion Services are offered to any Catholic person who is a resident at the Home. Our Ministers serve Riverstreet Manor, North Penn, Wesley Village, Highland Park and Timber Ridge. Our Ministers also bring Communion to our parishioners who are hospitalized. If you or your Loved One would desire Communion brought to your home regularly, please contact Sister Madonna, sscm. You may call the parish office at 570-825-6663 and press 5 to be connected with her voicemail. Leave your name and phone number and Sister will return your call without delay. GOD longs to be with us as much as we long to be with GOD. This is an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist when you are no longer able to attend Mass.
